

The score steadily climbed as both teams racked up points and goals with an incredible save by the goalie, Adam Grant, just before the half time mark.



Wednesday, one of the most anticipated shows on Netflix, dropped their second season finale on Wednesday, 3<sup>rd</sup> September.



Everything's connected, like a cobweb. This film is a cobwebbed thriller, based on bits and pieces of every classic cliché horror/thriller film.


